MOURTADA BOOTS LONGEST FIELD GOAL IN SCHOOL HISTORY IN LOSS TO SOUTHERN CONNECTICUT

SETTERS LOSE 40-17 TO Southern Connecticut

PLEASANTVILLE, NY- The Pace football team lost to the Owls of Southern Connecticut State University 40-17 in Northeast-10 Conference action this afternoon. The Setters drop to 4-4 overall and 3-3 in the NE-10, while the Owls improve to 6-2 and 3-3 in conference play.

The Setters got on the board first as they capitalized on an Owl miscue. Pace linebacker **Brian Schuster (Miller Place, NY/Miller Place)** intercepted a pass by Southern QB Chris Roberts, setting up the Setter offense deep in Owl territory. The Pace offense wasted no time in taking advantage of the turnover as QB **Dean Trerotola (Brooklyn, NY/Xaverian)** hit **Eric Ortega (Staten Island, NY/St. Peter's)** for a 33-yard touchdown strike on the first play following the interception.

The Owls responded with 27 unanswered points as Roberts would throw three touchdowns, while Jerom Freeman would score on the ground from one yard out.

A Pace school record would be shattered on this day as place kicker **Ali Moutada (Foxboro, MA/Foxboro)** would boot a 52-yard field late in the first half, eclipsing the old mark of 45-yard held by Scott Pluschau set on November 11, 1989 against Stony Brook.

Southern would add to their lead on the first possession of the second half as Roberts would toss his fourth TD in the air, hitting Ty Marshall on a 34-yard connection for a 34-10 lead.

The Setters would pull closer late in the third as Trerotola would punch it in from a yard out to move

the score to 34-17. The Owls' John Wiechman, who earlier caught a 4-yard touchdown pass, would score in the ground from 19 yards out for the final margin.

For the Setters, Trerotola, subbing for an injured Ray Gregg, tossed for 120 yards on 13-for-25 passes, one touchdown and a pair of interceptions on the day. **Nathaniel Ford (Queen, NY/Jamaica)** led the Setters in rushing, carrying the ball 19 times for 68 yards. **Pat Olchovy (Islip, NY/Islip)** and Ortega both had 40 receiving yards with Ortega getting the touchdowns and Olchovy leading in receptions with five. As a team the Owls outgained the Setters in total offense 477-188.

Defensively, the Setters had four players in double figures in tackles, led by **Michael LaMonica (Beachwood, NJ/Toms River South)** with 14. **Jonathan Jones (Dover, NH/Bridgton Academy)** totaled 13 tackles, including nine solo. **Lee Robinson (New Milford, CT/New Milford)** tallied 12 while **Greg Brain (Westtown, NY/Minisink Valley)** rounded out the top tacklers with 11.

The Setters return to action next Saturday, November 1, when Pace travels to Waltham, MA to take on the Falcons of Bentley University in a Northeast-10 Conference game set for a 1:00 pm kickoff.

WOMEN'S SOCCER EARNS A TIE WITH GEORGIAN COURT

LAKESWOOD, NJ- **Dania D'Alessandro's (Victor, NY/Victor)** goal in the 89th minute of play to tie the game at two forcing overtime. Both overtimes were scoreless as the game ended knotted at two. The Setters move their record to 2-11-1, while the Lions now stand at 8-6-4 on the season.

The Setters struck first as freshman **Mariah Darrah (Newburgh, NY/Newburgh)** took a feed from **Ashley Sommers (Highland Mills, NY/Monroe-Woodbury)**

put Pace up 1-0 in the 36th minute. The Lions would tie up just four minutes later as Candace Seaton scored off an assist by Kelly Lyons.

Georgian Court would take the lead early in the second half as Lyons would put the Lions up 2-1 off an assist by Shannon Mastrogiovanni.

The Setters remained down one goal until the final minutes of play as D'Alessandro's would net the equalizer with 1:40 left in the regulation to force overtime off an assist by **Cynthia Mendoza (Costa Mesa, CA/Costa Mesa)**.

The teams attempted five shots each in both overtime periods with none finding the back of the nets as the Setters earned their second straight draw.

Pace goalkeeper **Breanna Gault (Oneonta, NY/Oneonta)** went the distance, notching five saves on the day. Georgian Court's Lindsay Hammond matched Gault's effort, recording nine saves for the game

Pace held the advantage on shots, 20-1, while the Lions led on corner kicks 5-3.

The Setters return to action on Saturday, October 25 when they will host the Penmen of Southern New Hampshire University in a Northeast-10 Conference game. Prior to Saturday's 3:30 pm start, the Setters will honor two of the seniors for their careers at Pace.

SETTERS FALL TO SOUTHERN NEW HAMPSHIRE IN OVERTIME

BRAIRCLIFF, NY- Southern New Hampshire's Ariel Teixeira goal nearly four minutes into overtime handed the Setters a heartbreaking loss on senior day. The Setters drop to 2-12-2 overall and 2-11-0 in the NE-10, while the Penmen improve to 8-4-3 overall and 7-4-2 in conference play.

The Penmen would net the lone goal of the opening half as Sophia St. Paul tallied her eighth goal of the season in the 19th minute of play off an assist from Nicole Ebner.

Allyson Dyl's (Kearny, NJ/Kearny) netted the equalizer in the 63rd minute of the second half, eventually forcing an extra period of play.

In overtime, the Penmen would take three shots with the final one coming off the foot of Teixeira for the game-winner.

Pace goalkeeper **Monique Morey (Port Orchard, WA/South Kitsap)** went the distance, posting five saves, while the Penmen's Stef Young stopped 10 shots by the Setters on the day.

Pace held the advantage in corner kicks, 4-2, while the Penmen led in shot 22-18.

Prior to the game, the Setters honored two of their seniors for the careers in a Pace uniform. Senior **Casey Melilli (Poughkeepsie, NY/Our Lady of Lourdes)** has seen action in 52 career games, totaling five points and earlier this season, she netted the game-winning goal in the Setters' 3-1 victory over American International. The second senior was **Tiffany Robinson (Shelton, CT/Shelton)**, who despite missing the entire 2008 season due to an injury ended her career at Pace tied for eighth all-time in school history in points with 24.

The Setters returns to action on Tuesday, October 28 when Pace travels to Albany, NY to square off against the College of Saint Rose in Northeast-10 action and the Setters' season finale. The game is scheduled for a 3:45 pm start.

WOMEN'S SOCCER ENDS SEASON WITH LOSS TO #25 SAINT ROSE

LATHAM, NY- The Pace women's soccer season ended this afternoon with a 3-1 loss to #25-ranked College of Saint Rose in Northeast-10 Conference action. The Setters wrap up their season with a 2-13- record and 2-12-0 NE-10 record, while the Golden Knights improve to 14-3-1 and 11-2-1 in conference play.

The Golden Knights struck first as Christina Cuffari netted the game's first goal in the 34th minute off an assist from Jaclyn Evans.

Cynthia Mendoza (Costa Mesa, CA/Costa Mesa) tapped in a deflection off the cross bar for the equalizer in the 71st minute of play to knot the score at one.

Saint Rose retook the lead in the 77th minute as Jordan Bowers gave the Golden Knights a 2-1 lead.

Derith Fernades would tack on an insurance goal three minutes for a 3-1 score.

Pace goalkeeper **Monique Morey (Port Orchard, WA/South Kitsap)** went the distance, posting 13 saves. For Saint Rose, Shannon Murphy kept the Setters off the board in the first half, while Jillian Lyons finished out in the second half, allowing one goal.

WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL
BENTLEY DOWNS PACE IN WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL

PLEASANTVILLE, NY- The Pace women's volleyball team dropped a Northeast-10 Conference match to the Falcons of Bentley University 3-0 (23-25, 19-25, 15-25). The Setters fall to 12-11 overall and 4-5 in the NE-10, while the Falcons improve to 15-10 and 8-2 in conference play.

The Setters were led by **Victoria Pompilus (Mt. Vernon, NY/Mt Vernon)** and **Korena Johnson (Friendswood, TX/Clear Brook)** each tallied eight kills for the match. **Stephanie Kazmierczak (Buffalo, NY/City Honors)** totaled a team-best 15 digs, while **Jessica Anderson (East Northport, NY/Half Hollow Hills East)** chipped in 13. **Shea Hansen (Mesa, AZ/Red Mountain)** posted a match-high 24 assists along with five digs and two kills.

Pace return to action on Wednesday, October 29, when the Setters travel to the Springfield, MA for a Northeast-10 Conference match against American International College scheduled for a 7:00 pm start.

WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL LOSES TO AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL

SPRINGFIELD, MA- The Pace women's volleyball team dropped its fifth straight match against American International College 3-1 (21-25, 16-25, 25-19, 21-25) in Northeast-10 Conference match. The Setters even their record at 12-12 overall and fall to 4-6 in the NE-10, while the Yellow Jackets improve to 12-9 and 8-3 in conference play.

Danielle Furka (Massapequa, NY/Massapequa) tallied a team-high 11 kills along with a .286 hitting percentage. **Victoria Pompilus (Mt. Vernon, NY/Mt Vernon)** totaled nine kills and six total blocks, while

Korena Johnson (Friendswood, TX/Clear Brook) posted eight kills. **Stephanie Kazmierczak (Buffalo, NY/City Honors)** tied for the match-high in digs with 13, while **Shea Hansen (Mesa, AZ/Red Mountain)** also tied for the match-high in assists with 33.

Pace return to action on Saturday, November 1, when the Setters travel to the Syracuse, NY for a Northeast-10 Conference match against Le Moyne College scheduled for a 12:00 pm start.

MEN'S AND WOMEN'S SWIMMING AND DIVING
MEN'S SWIMMING FALLS, WHILE WOMEN DEFEAT STATEN ISLAND
CALLIE GRACE SET SCHOOL RECORD IN WOMEN'S VICTORY

STATEN ISLAND, NY- The Pace women's swimming team defeated the College of Staten Island 107-94, while the men's team lost 148-68 in a dual meet. **Callie Grace (Dalton, MA/Miss Halls)** set the school record in the 100-breast stroke with a new time of 1:12.46, eclipsing the old time of 1:13.22, set by Kristine Robinson in 2005.

In the 400-medley relay, the quartet of **Erin Johanson (Wakefield, MA/Wakefield)**, Grace, **Chelsea Oberhauser (Cream Ridge, NJ/Notre Dame)**, and **Angela Calia (Bellmore, NY/JFK)** took first place with a time of 4:31.54. In individual events, Grace had a pair of first place finishes, including winning the 200 IM with a time of 2:23.48. Oberhauser also won a two events, taking the top spot in the 100-fly with a time of 1:06.98 and the 100-backstroke, posting a time of 1:04.26. **Cassandra Gentile (Cortland Manor, NY/Walter Panas)** was the Setters lone diver and took first place in the 1-meter and 3-meter events. Johanson won the 200-freestyle with a time of 2:05.94, while finishing in second place in the 100-back with a time of 1:06.46. Calia won the 500-freestyle, posting a time of 6:14.27. **Laura Carvajal (Norwalk, CT/Brien McMahon)** took first in the 100-freestyle with a time of 1:01.53 and finished second in the 100-breaststroke with a time of 1:23.31.

On the men's side, the 400-freestyle relay team of **Will King (Oakdale, NY/Connetquot)**, **Peter Byrnes (Kingston, PA/Wyoming Valley West)**, **Craig McClintock (Valhalla, NY/Valhalla)** and **Trevor Paugh (Wantage, NJ/High Point Regional)** won the event with a time of 3:44.04. Individually, Paugh won the 200-IM with a time of 2:11.21, while taking second

in the 100-breaststroke, posting a time of 1:08.85. McClintock won the 500-freestyle with a time of 5:31.96, while King also won his event, the 100-freestyle with a time of 54.18 seconds.

Pace returns to action when they travel to Waltham, MA to participate in the Bentley University Invitational on Sunday, October 26. The meet is scheduled to start at 9:00 am.

MEN'S SWIMMING PLACES 8TH, WOMEN TAKE 6TH AT BENTLEY INVITATIONAL

CASSANDRA GENTILE SWEEPS DIVING EVENTS

WALTHAM, MA- The Pace women's swimming team finished in sixth place, while the men's team took eighth place at the Bentley Invitational this past weekend. **Cassandra Gentile (Cortland Manor, NY/Walter Panas)** swept the diving, taking home first place in the 1-meter and 3-meter events.

In the 400-medley relay, the quartet of **Erin Johanson (Wakefield, MA/Wakefield)**, **Callie Grace (Dalton, MA/Miss Halls)**, **Chelsea Oberhauser (Cream Ridge, NJ/Notre Dame)**, and **Laura Carvajal (Norwalk, CT/Brien McMahon)** took sixth place with a time of 4:27.11. Oberhauser would later take third place in the 200-meter backstroke with a time of 2:18.83 and pace fourth in the 50-freestyle posting a time of 27.22. Grace had a strong showing with a fifth place finish in the 100-freestyle with a time of 57.70 and took eighth place in the 200-IM with a time of 2:19.35. Johanson swam to a fourth place finish in the 200-backstroke with a time of 2:19.35.

On the men's side, the **Craig McClintock (Valhalla, NY/Valhalla)** took eighth place in the 200-backstroke with a time of 2:13.07. **Trevor Paugh (Wantage, NJ/High Point Regional)** finished in eighth place in the 200-breaststroke with a time of 2:27.78.

Pace returns to action when they travel to the Bronx, NY for a dual meet against Lehman College on Saturday, November 1 at 1:00 pm.
